ATTACHMENT PROCEDURE

Use a 100 Southpaw Safety Snap to fasten your Southpaw Pull Handles to your hook up.

MAINTENANCE CHECKLIST

All of the following wear points should be checked on a monthly basis and recorded on the enclosed checklist.

- Check for loose or missing metal rope clips, if found discontinue use.
- Check for cracks in plastic handles, if found discontinue use.
- Check rope for wear, if excessive wear is found discontinue use.

MATTING PRECAUTIONS

A FLOOR MAT OF PROPER THICKNESS SHOULD BE POSITIONED APPROPRIATELY UNDER ALL SUSPENDED EQUIPMENT.

CLEANING INSTRUCTIONS

- Clean with a damp cloth.
- Do not immerse in water.

STORAGE PROCEDURES

- Clean handles with a damp cloth. Do not immerse in water.
