## IEP Goals for Somatosensory Bead Chain Curtain

Even the most profoundly challenged children will reach out to this popular bead chain curtain. It is mounted on a sturdy base and rubber suction cups hold it in place.

## Activity #1: "What can you find?"

Level: easy

**Ages:** 12 months and up

Diagnoses: Pervasive Developmental Disorder/Autism, developmental delay, mental retardation, and cerebral palsy, blind or visual impairments.

**Materials needed**: small familiar items that can be attached to one or several beaded chains.

How to set up: Use string or ribbon to tie a small object (a child's pacifier, a small squeeze toy, a small colorful furry animal etc.) to one or two of the beaded chains. It will be possible to attach two small items at the same time, one at each end of the beaded chain frame. As the child reaches for the familiar stimulation of the beaded chains, they will have the added surprise of finding and feeling another object. Verbal children can answer the question, "What did you find?" while non-verbal children can have the added tactile discovery of an object amidst the dazzling, swinging chains!

<u>Activity Analysis #1:</u> Skills and Performance Components this toy and activity will address:

- **Cognitive-** cause and effect, object recognition, scanning, focus and attention
- Motor- Active range of motion, crossing the midline,

- motor control for grasp and release, visual-motor integration
- **Sensory** tactile, visual and Somatosensory processing, stimulation and discrimination
